Assignment 8 – Due Session 12

1. Read Sterne and Akiyama's essay "The Recording That Never Wanted to Be Heard and Other Stories of Sonification"

As you read, think about the ways Sterne and Akiyama use "sonification" as something that might be analogous to practices of visualization and spatialization we've discussed so far—what does this comparison reveal about representing data through different domains?—but also about the ways that these stories break sound out from this analogy—what are they claiming about our unique relationship to sound? What might it mean, in your research areas, to work *through* or *into* sound, and what new avenues could a sonic approach open up?
