Problem 5(10 points) Compute the following derivatives. Please show all work to receive full credit.

(a)(5 points)

$$y = \sinh(t) = \frac{e^t - e^{-t}}{2}, \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = ?$$

(b)(5 points)

$$y = \sinh^{-1}(x) = \ln(x + \sqrt{x^2 + 1}), \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = ?$$

There are at least 2 methods. You may use the one you prefer.

Extra credit(5 points)

$$y = \sin(\tan^{-1}(2x)), \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = ?$$
