Feminist Ideology Criteria

- Gender equality in the workforce
 - Movement away from traditional household role
- Freedom of Romance
 - Usually of a man forbidden by society/others
- Freedom of expression through rebellion
 - Involves revolt against an opressor

Like Water for Chocolate

- Tita no desire to break free of domesticity
 - Gertrudis becomes a General
- Tita's secret affair with Pedro
 - Her mother's past affair which led to a child
- Tita's revolt against her mother

Dreaming in Cuban

- Lourdes career as the owner of a bakery
- Lourdes' desire to marry an unapproved man
 - Celia lusts after a man who has moved away from her
- Felicia's revolt against Hugo
 - Appropriate response?

Real Women Have Curves

- Ana's desire to receive higher education
- Ana's relationship with Jimmy
- Her rebellion against social norms set by her mother

Girl Fight

- Diana's interest in a boxing career
- Her determination to fight against Adrian
- Diana's rebellion against her father
